Re: EJCCA Summer Club Junior League Cricket Bye-Laws
New Junior Cricket Bye-Law
Team Manager / Coach / Adult Supervision

The EJCCA would like to ensure absolute clarity, it is our aim to see as many young players joining our affiliated Club Structures and enjoying this wonderful game. However, not at the risk of players hosting or arriving at matches without proper Adult Supervision. It would be irresponsible for Eastern Cricket and the EJCCA to allow our young players being placed in harms way.

The following new junior cricket Bye-law comes into **immediate effect** (5th February 2018) as discussed with Eastern Cricket Officials without any debate.

The new Bye-law 4.9 shall be added and form part of **SECTION 4: THE TEAM** as contained in the current bye-laws.

- **Section 4.9 – Team Manager / Coach / Adult Supervision**

All EJCCA Affiliated Club Officials shall ensure that each and every team in the Under 8, Under 10 and Under 12 age groups are accompanied by an Adult. This in the form of either a Team Manager, or Team Coach, or Parent or responsible Adult older than Eighteen (18) years old.

Such a person shall accompany and control their respective team to any EJCCA Summer Junior Club League Cricket Fixture, for both home and away matches.

Any club team hosting or playing away from home “Without Adult Supervision” should be reported to the EJCCA Executive, such an offending team shall face suspension from the EJCCA Summer Junior Club League. Therefore, a default in this regard shall constitute an offence after One (1) incident.

The community entrusts their children into our club structures, therefore the safety of our children comes first before anything else.

The EJCCA calls on your support, assistance and commitment. Let there be No further incident of this nature going forward.
